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This guide supports you in planning and delivering Holocaust Memorial Day (HMD) activities on or around 27 January.

Holocaust Memorial Day (HMD)

HMD takes place every year on 27 January, the anniversary of the liberation of Auschwitz-Birkenau, the largest Nazi death camp. It is an international day to remember the 6 million Jews murdered during the Holocaust and the millions of people murdered under the Nazi persecution of other groups and in more recent genocides in Cambodia, Rwanda, Bosnia and Darfur.

HMD is an occasion for everyone to come together to learn, remember, reflect and consider what action we can take to stand up to hatred, discrimination and racism in the world today. There is still much to do to create a safer future and marking HMD is an opportunity to start this process in your school.

The <u>HMD guidelines for teachers</u> from HMDT help you identify age-appropriate ways to introduce and discuss the Holocaust and more recent genocides in schools. Lesson plans, assemblies, life stories life stories of those affected by genocide, including survivors and those who were murdered, and other materials are available <u>here</u>.

Holocaust Memorial Day Quiz tests in 10 questions what your pupils learnt during the assembly. It is designed to consolidate learning of key points and to be a starting point for classroom discussion.

Experiences of Discrimination Newspaper

Pupils are encouraged to investigate either a famous person or someone in their family who has overcome discrimination and write a newspaper article to celebrate their achievements. This activity expands the lessons of the assembly to consider ways in which discrimination has taken place in the past and continues today. Your pupils can research a historical figure, such as Nelson Mandela or Martin Luther King, or a sportsperson, singer or actor.

Holocaust Memorial Day Pledge

This activity asks pupils to make their own pledges to make sure there is no discrimination in their school. You can use this opportunity to encourage pupils to consider how they are part of preventing this behaviour.

Letter about Freedoms and Rights

Pupils are asked to write a letter to persuade the reversal of new laws that discriminate against them based on the colour of their hair or eyes. This activity is designed for pupils to carefully consider and articulate the consequences and impact of discrimination on the lives of those who are targeted.
