## Introduction

These spreadsheet lessons have been designed to be used on a range of devices including tablets. We advise when you are dealing with larger spreadsheet data sets then laptops or desktops are the preferred devices.

2Calculate is a simple to use spreadsheet (and more!) for beginners and beyond.
A user guide can be found at 2Calculate User Guide.
The following guide contains a Scheme of Work for teaching the use of spreadsheets as part of the Computing curriculum.

The lessons show a progression of knowledge and skills from lesson to lesson and year to year. Children who have not used 2Calculate before will benefit by using the crash course. Teachers who are not familiar with the tools in 2Calculate might find reviewing the lessons for younger children helpful to build up their own knowledge.

## Differentiation

The use of spreadsheets has a strong link to mathematics. Some children might have difficulty with the mathematical concepts in some lessons and might need guidance with this aspect. For example, in lessons where spreadsheets are being used to add up prices; children who are not familiar with converting pence (45p) to pounds (£0.45) might need this aspect explained in more details; in lessons dealing with percentages and fractions some children might need extra support for the mathematical concepts.

Where appropriate, guidance has been given on how to simplify tasks within lessons or challenge those who are ready for more stretching tasks. The lesson plans are progressive so if a child has not completed plans from a previous year, there might be tools that they are unfamiliar with and will need extra guidance.

If children have not used and logged onto Purple Mash before then they will need to spend some time before starting these lessons, learning how to do this. Young children can be supported by having their printed logon cards (produced using Create and Manage Users) to hand.

| Activity 3: Adding <br> Another Data Set | Use slide $\mathbf{7}$ to support children in adding another data set. Children to <br> attempt to answer the questions revealed on the slide. <br> If you wish the children to save the charts, set the 2Publish Plus template <br> 'Blank Simple Leaflet' as a 2Do, children should screenshot and save the <br> graphs*. They can then open the leaflet 2Do and insert the saved graphs <br> into the picture boxes by uploading the images from their device. The <br> method will need to be demonstrated to children. <br> *The method will depend upon device type and operating system. On a <br> Windows PC press the windows button + Shift + 's' to open the snipping <br> tool: children will need to be shown how to snip and save the snip. On an <br> apple tablet, screen shots are often made by pressing the home and onloff <br> keys together, on Android by pressing onloff key and volume button or <br> swiping the screen up and then you get the option to screenshot: children <br> will need to be shown how to screenshot then crop and save the image. |

- Example budget sheets; budget sheet no formulae and budget sheet with formulae there are 2 versions of this sheet. The simpler version (budget spreadsheet no formulae) does not use formulas. The more advanced version (budget spreadsheet with formulae) uses formulae. If children are familiar with the formula wizard from previous lessons, they can use the formula version but some children might find the simpler version enhances their understanding of the process.

Ask children to make their own budget sheet using the <br> key requirements revealed on the slide e.g., formatting cells. *To save <br> time, you might let the children adapt the example budget spreadsheet <br> shown on slide 6 rather than start from scratch. |
| Activity 2: Sudden <br> Changes | Display slide 8. Go through the sudden changes shown on the slide and <br> ask children to modify their budget spreadsheets to accommodate these <br> changes. |
| Activity 3: <br> Extension | Display slide 9 to introduce an extension activity. Tell the children the <br> budget has gone down to £100. Ask them to consider the changes they <br> will make and justify why. |

## Assessment Guidance

| Exceeding | Children demonstrating greater depth will explore more complex functioning <br> of the 2Calculate tools to create their own spreadsheets to explore number <br> and interpret their own data. <br> They will intuitively grasp the concept of using a spreadsheet to model a real- <br> life situation and calculate solutions. <br> Children demonstrating greater depth will use 2Calculate to design a range of <br> different graphs which present data in a variety of ways and select the most <br> appropriate one to independently to solve mathematical problems (Unit 4.3 <br> Lesson 5). |
